Research – Melissa Hofmann/Karen Pifher

- Submitted VALE and NJLA proposals and possible poster session for NJLA.

Technology – Denise O'Shea

Committee has been working on finalizing speakers and topics for next year's NJLA conference based on committee recommendations at our Sept. meeting, and from input from the Executive Board. Following is a list of the programs that I am planning to propose on behalf of our committee:

1. The Technology Forum – presentations from nominees for the 2011 Technology Award.
2. Two programs by Kenley Neufeld (<http://kenleyneufeld.com/>), Director of the Santa Barbara City College Library in California.
 - a. Innovation, Risk and Failure – based on a popular track at this year's Internet Librarian conference in California. The topic is learning from failure.
 - b. We are we going with Social Media? – Kenley has taught 2 semesters of a social media class on his campus, manages a robust portfolio of social apps for his library, and has a solid understanding of where we are at the moment and where it might be leading us.

Please note: I have recommended that the Conference Committee also consider Kenley for one of the Keynote Speaker and or pre-conference slots. I am waiting to hear back on that.

- On October 18th, Denise gave a presentation on Social Media and Web Tools at the NJLA Adult Services Forum at the Monmouth County Library in Manalapan. User Education – Nancy Weiner

Membership – Paul Martinez

- NJLA is looking for ways to reach out to academic, community to increase membership. Where are good places to publish? Need to emphasize NJLA's role in getting funding for academics. Suggestions that testimonials be used from current members. Talk to Rutgers volunteers at the VALE conference.

Newsletter – Julie Maginn

- Lots of submissions for the newsletter, resulting in a longer document. Working on the newsletter will be easier with new committee members Lisa Price and Harry Glazer. Expect many submissions for the spring as well.

Nomination – Steven Shapiro

- Solicitations for nominations for VP/President Elect, Secretary and Membership will go out in an email in mid-November for next year's elections.

Legislative/VALE Liaison - Luis Rodriguez

- No report as legislature has not been in session.
- Academic officers (2year colleges) are meeting on 11/9/10 and the information literacy discussion is expected to come up again. Nancy will contact Pam Price to speak to her representative.

NJLA Liaison - Gary Schmidt

- No report.

Old Business

- Job shadowing - Trevor spoke to Julie Still. She is trying to find a more effective way to identify participants earlier. Happy to continue working on the program and the Exec Committee would like her to continue in this position. Currently 2 people are doing job shadowing. Trevor will publicize sponsorship of job shadow participants to attend NJLA 2011. Call out to SCI, recommend staff and librarians. Mary Mallory will list job shadowing under career services.

New Business

- **Proposal for Communication Committee** - Mary Mallory led a discussion regarding the formation of a Communication Committee. Mary provided several examples of how other chapters handle communications - Iowa ACRL (Electronic Communications Committee), Wisconsin ACRL (Communication Committee), and Washington State. After discussion of how the other states define their committees, a task force was set up to deliberate on the scope of the work to be covered by the new committee and how it will interact with already-existing committees. Task force members: Mary, Denise, Julie, Paul, Trevor. The task force will make a recommendation to the executive board at the February 2011 meeting.
- **Review of online meeting tools** - in general, everyone was satisfied with both Princeton's iLink and FDU's WebX tools for online meetings. They seem to address all our needs. A request will be made to the NJLA Executive Board for a state-wide conferencing tool that is available to all NJLA committees for meetings. This will allow for continuity in access as there are changes in committee memberships, rather than relying on specific schools.
- **LISSA** - Trevor mentioned that LISSA is soliciting recommendations from board for a 3 person panel of academic librarians for a spring presentation. Suggestion was to have librarians representing different functions in the library - reference, tech services, instruction, special collections.
